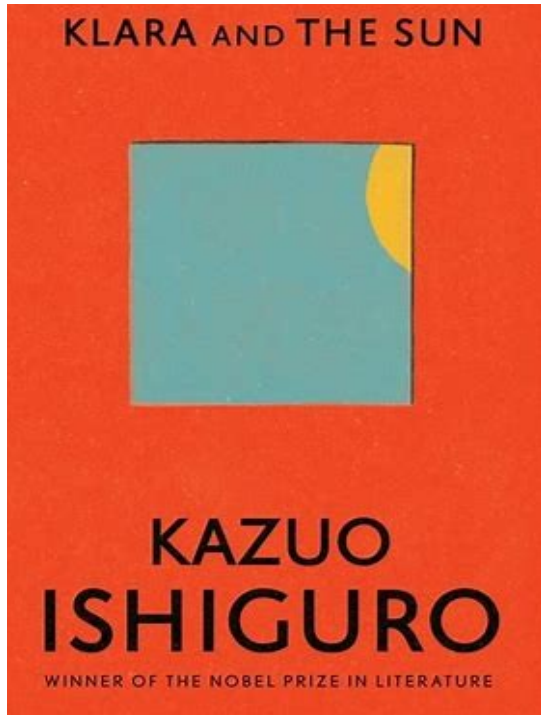


Klara and The Sun

Consider AP Lit Big Ideas:

- Character
- Setting
- Structure
- Narration
- Figurative Language
- Literary Argumentation (How do each of the big ideas listed above contribute to complex themes explored in the novel?)

While Reading . . .

- Actively engage in the three levels of reading: Read ON the lines. Read BETWEEN the lines. Read BEYOND the lines.
- Annotate the text.
- Prepare ten open-ended questions for our Socratic discussion on the first day of school. Consider the complexity and nuance of the novel. Which characters are complex? What makes them complex? How does that complexity create meaning in the novel? What about setting, structure, narration? Figurative language?

Be Prepared To . . .

- Use your questions to help guide our discussion and provide a deeper understanding of the complexity and nuance of the big ideas and various themes presented in the novel.
- Write an in-class essay meeting the expectations of a rubric.
